
# Jeel THE YARN 2016





**Feel the Yarn** - directed by the **CPF- Consorzio Promozione Filati** and **Pitti Immagine**, with the support of prestigious sponsors – has now reached its seventh edition. The competition is dedicated to designers from a selection of the best international fashion schools and aims at supporting young talents in the world of knitwear.

This year the contest will feature the participation of **26 students** selected from **13 prestigious international fashion-design schools** as well as **22 Italian yarn mills** coordinated by the Consorzio Promozione Filati which are attending Pitti Filati with their Fall/Winter 2017-18 collections.

As usual the objective is to promote the emergence of young international design talents in knitwear and fashion by valorizing their ability to realize original creations, exalting the potential of the most innovative Italian yarns. The students will be called upon to measure themselves against the topic of **KNITt(in)g TIME**: knits as an expression of the rhythm of daily life, for 24 hours of pure creativity.

Feel the Yarn has always been an effective instrument of dialogue between Italian yarn manufacturers and the world of young international creatives. An objective also made possible by the joint efforts of the many manufacturing companies that have found in the Consortium a point of convergence and an ideal business-to-business platform.

With its involvement in Feel the Yarn, Pitti Immagine is once again investing in the promotion and support of new generations of fashion and knitwear designers. The students' work will be presented in a special area with a striking display located in the heart of the fair.

A strong incentive to analyze the high level of creativity of our yarns in even greater depth: this is the aim that we are certain to achieve once again this year also thanks to the extraordinary passion for knitwear of the competition's coordinator, Ornella Bignami.



Through plastic foil and silicone, I achieve an unusual knit fabric which is water resistant and has an attractive matt shine. I have chosen 3 energetic colors (pink, orange, yellow) balanced with a calming blue. The garments are a synthesis of multiple layers. A playful combination of wide and narrow patterns. Rubber is implemented to shape the volume. With the use of a special "nylon" yarn, I achieved a transparent optic effect and I introduced some tapes that reflects at night.
