
Jeel THE YARN 2017





The hidden lies within politics and the creation of false hope and unrealistic ideas for the public have left the truth to be found beneath a fragile and delicate outer layer. In order to project this, knitted garments are crystallised by submerging them in a salt solution and leaving them to air dry naturally. The salt crystallises to stiffen the fabric and leaves a layer of transparent or white crystal-like formations. This unsustainable layer

alters the garment that was once soft and mobile to become crunchy, heavy and solid, yet easily destroyed by touch and movement. My knitwear designs emulate this crystallisation and notions of concealment by creating textures of transparency mixed with areas of thickness and weight. With details and textures only to be found once the garments are opened, worn and looked

There is rigor in the silhouettes, in the shapes, but inside the contours, there is dynamism of lines, shapes and colours, all together, they merge into a harmonious space. There is, therefore, harmony, explosion of emotions, and, sometimes similar, sometimes complementary energies.

I used the shape of bird that has various forms as design motif. I mixed low-gauge yarn and middle gauge yarn for bulky shape in collar and sleeves, and they mean bird's wings. Also a featherlike structure is added to the inner knit. The skirt used pleats pattern, alginate fiber and crochet knit, the decorative parts were added. In this part, diverse shape of crochet knit gives a featherlike image.

From the portrait of the four characters comes a complex mixture of stitches dictating the shape of the collection. A geometric jacquard, once expressive and defined, easily becomes a blurred harmony of gentle tones when looked from the back. Knitting stitches are so powerful that can make the dress asymmetric and deform the shape. Nature inspired veining runs along the sleeves, while floating yarns and crumpled effects finish the product.






